□ is the State's leading agency serving individuals with disabilities.

DRS works in partnership with people with disabilities and their families to assist them in making informed choices to achieve full community participation through employment, education and independent living opportunities.

Two Programs -

Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) and Home Service (HSP)





Who we are

- Vocational Rehabilitation
 - Federally mandated program in each state (cannot transfer a case between states)
 - 80% Federal funding, 20% state funding
 - Mission: To assist individuals with disabilities in obtaining and maintain competitive integrated employment

What we do

- Provide employment services and counseling to people with disabilities (customers).
- Provide or arrange for services to enable an individual to go to work.
- Assist our customers achieve their education goals at a university or community college.
- Provide training and technical assistance to employers regarding disability employment issues.



Presumption of DRS Job Seekers

<u>MYTH</u>

Only a person who uses a wheelchair, or persons with significant intellectual disabilities.

Who do we serve

- Job Seeker with a disability who faces barrier to employment.
- Educators
- Community Organizations
- Employers/Businesses



Job Seeker with a Disability

- Referral
 - Can be made by customer, family member, advocate, guardian etc.
 - Initial interview made after 30 days
- Application
 - Meet with VR counselor for initial interview
 - Documentation from medical provider required indicating disability.
- Individual Plan for Employment (IPE)



Why are we here?

- According to the US Bureau of Labor Statistics in 2019 the unemployment rate*:
 - People without a disability is **3.7%**
 - People with a disability is **8.5%**
- There are benefits to hiring people with disabilities.



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Workforce Development Unit

- Revisiting our mission and objective:
 - DRS provides solutions for the workforce needs of business customers while preparing talented, qualified job seekers with disabilities for their chosen careers.
 - Assist the business community to is discovering the talents of people with disabilities.
 - Focusing on the ABILITY and NOT disability.

Workforce Development Unit

- Facilitate the establishment and maintenance of working relationships with the business community to continually generate solutions for area business needs
- Work with businesses to expand competitive employment opportunities for persons with disabilities
- Consult and provide support to field staff regarding labor markets, industry sector needs, business expectations and employment opportunities
