- 2. What type of working relationship do you plan to have with neighborhood groups?

I am committed to 4 town halls a year and being an active and engaged council member that will be constantly available to assist the neighborhood councils with city updates on a regular basis. They are a very important part of the community and provide a wealth of information to the residents they serve . I am committed to taking back their concerns to the mayor and council as a good partner should always do.

3. Please share your thoughts on possible economic development opportunities within your district.

The community would love to see family friendly economic development on the south side of Joliet including a Huge grocery store that would provide fresh, affordable healthy offerings. I am certain this is a possibility.

The residents want to see economic development beyond trucking and warehousing that will improve their quality of life.

4. What would you do to improve the overall safety of citizens in your district and in the City of Joliet?

Neighborhood oriented policing is a model that I feel we should bring back to the city of Joliet.

I am the only candidate sans the incumbent that has served on any level of government. My experience as a health equity navigator first with the Will County Health Department and currently with Holsten Human Capital Development has put me in the center of peoples issues and concerns all over Will County with a particular focus on Block 3 in the city of Jolet.

My grant partners are community based organizations with their pulse on what this community needs are, and we work on a daily basis to solve these issues one by one. We also survey the community regularly and I can tell you the top 5 concerns in our area. This career has prepared me well with a vast knowledge of services and how to get residents assistance without delay..

7. Have you previously or are you currently serving on a governing board such as a business, nonprofit, other government, or a religious or education organization?

I am currently elected since April 2021 as a Joliet Township Trustee. I will be resigning that position as a trustee after my City Council win.

8. If so, how would this experience prepare you for this role and if not, do you believe this lack of experience would be a concern for voters?

I have been an active and engaged part of the Township Board.

I have made many community partners over the last two years and learned a tremendous amount about government .

9. What level of interaction do you plan to hold with constituents and do you feel that you have the ability to be continually accessible?

I will be the most active and engaged council person. I am continuously available to the public via calls, email, texts and being out in the community on a daily basis. When you are a public servant you serve 24/7. I am an overachiever in every sense of the word.

10. Do you believe that the city is providing quality services such as water, garbage removal, sewer, snow removal, and infrastructure?

The water project is moving ahead at a good pace however, affordability is still a top priority for many residents. We also need a great deal of infrastructure improvements, in particular with our roadways.

I would also advocate for the city to assume responsibility for the entry corridors that look so terrible now. We can do this with a partnership between the state and city in exchange for some revenue if the city s maintaining the upkeep

11. How would you work to improve communication with the citizens of Joliet? I work every day communicating with residents the various updates regarding the township programs and services.

I have given updates via every form of social media there is, neighborhood meetings and councils, senior events, social clubs, community based organizations, non profits. I feel there is room for improvement when the residents come to city council and they are disregarded and at times disrespected.

Residents need to see change and feel the council and Mayor is listening to them . I have also seen the ordinance that was created for residents to use their 4 minute time and I am sure that does not supersede your first amendment rights to freedom of speech. This is the reason the council meetings are so poorly attended.

12. What strategic alliances can be explored and/or better utilized? Do you feel the city has a solid relationship with county, state, and federal elected officials? Please explain why or why not and how that can be improved.?

There is room for improvement at every level. This is something I have worked on as a Joliet Township Trustee . Creating alliances at every level of government to work together and better serve our great city is vital.

Joliet Township Government worked with the officials at a state level to apply for a 1.9 Million dollar violence prevention grant that we then received. Bringing more services by working in partnership with other agencies and officials at every level of government is a way to keep tax dollars low and bring vital community services that can be transformational in the city Joliet. This can be achieved at state and federal levels.
